## Leveraging a \$5,000 Gift to a Permanently-Restricted Endowment by utilizing the Montana Endowment Tax Credit

Example for donors, ages 65 and 64, in the 24% Federal Income Tax bracket and 6.9% Montana Income Tax bracket

## Given Outright

(not through a Planned Gift)

\$ 5,000 charitable contribution =

\$ 1,200 Federal deduction

\$ 345 Montana deduction

\$ 1,545 Total tax benefit

Out of pocket "cost" of making a \$5,000 gift is \$3,455.

## Given through a Planned Gift

(in this example, a Deferred Charitable Gift Annuity\*)

\$4.593 charitable contribution =

1,102 Federal deduction

+ \$1,837 Montana CREDIT

\$2,939 Total tax benefit

Out of pocket "cost" of making a \$5,000 gift is just **\$2,061!** \*
